**Dawn Geisert** is senior vice president and chief compliance officer at Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

In this role, Geisert oversees business ethics and corporate compliance programs, including education and training programs, compliance plan development and reporting mechanisms, compliance investigations, vulnerability and risk assessment and administering the conflict of interest policy and programs. She also has leadership responsibility for an enterprise risk management program and a centralized accreditation compliance support team.

Geisert came to Beaumont from Henry Ford Health System where she served as chief compliance officer for Health Alliance Plan for two years. Prior to joining Henry Ford, she had an 18-year career with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and Blue Care Network of Michigan serving as a senior attorney in the Office of General Counsel, as assistant general counsel, and as a senior analyst in the Corporate Compliance Office, Corporate Key Accounts Marketing and HIPAA Project Office.

Geisert earned her law degree from the Michigan State University College of Law, a master's degree in General Administration from Central Michigan University and a bachelor's in Psychology from the University of Michigan.

Beaumont Health is Michigan's largest health care system and is most preferred for health care in Southeast Michigan, according to NRC Health survey data. The not-for-profit organization was created to provide patients with greater access to compassionate, extraordinary care, every day. Beaumont has a total net revenue of \$4.7 billion and consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 145 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
