Susan Grant is executive vice president and chief nursing officer at Beaumont Health., Michigan's largest health system.

Grant joined Beaumont in 2015 to oversee the nursing practice for the 10,000 nurses across Beaumont. She came from Emory Healthcare in Atlanta, where she served as chief nurse executive and chief patient services officer since 2006. Under her leadership, Emory adopted patient- and family-centered care as its approach to care delivery in partnership with more than 150 patient and family advisors and two of Emory's hospitals achieved Magnet designation. Grant also served on the system executive team managing the successful admissions and communications related to the first two patients with Ebola virus disease treated in the United States. In addition, she served as interim dean of the Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing at Emory University and associate dean for clinical leadership.

Prior to joining Emory, Grant was chief nursing officer and senior associate administrator for patient care services at the University of Washington Medical Center in Seattle and chief of nursing and patient care services at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in Boston. She began her career as a staff nurse at Emory University Hospital and the Medical College of Georgia.

Grant was a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellow and a Wharton Nursing Executive Fellow. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at the Medical College of Georgia, a master's degree in psychiatric and community mental health nursing at the University of South Carolina and her doctor of nursing practice degree from Vanderbilt University.

Beaumont Health is Michigan's largest health care system and is most preferred for health care in Southeast Michigan, according to NRC Health survey data. The not-for-profit organization was created to provide patients with greater access to compassionate, extraordinary care every day. Beaumont has a total net revenue of \$4.7 billion and consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 145 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
