Paul E. LaCasse, D.O., MPH is executive vice president of post-acute care and diversified business operations at Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

In this role, Dr. LaCasse manages post-acute services including medical transportation companies, home services, senior living facilities and services, laboratory and pathology services, specialty and retail pharmacies, joint ventures and diversified business entities. Dr. LaCasse came to Beaumont from Botsford Health Care, where he served as president and CEO. He began his career as an emergency medicine physician at Botsford Hospital (now Beaumont Hospital, Farmington Hills), where he also served as vice president of medical affairs and chief medical officer, executive vice president and chief operating officer.

Dr. LaCasse has served on the governing board of the Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine Statewide Campus System and the board of the Michigan Health & Hospital Association. He is a past chair of the Michigan Health & Hospital Association. He served on the American Osteopathic Association Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation and was chair of the American Osteopathic Association's Bureau of Hospitals. He received the Walter F. Patenge Medal of Public Service from Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine in 2006. The American Hospital Association, in partnership with the Michigan Health & Hospital Association, named LaCasse as the only Michigan recipient of its 2014 Grassroots Champions Award.

Dr. LaCasse earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan, a Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine from Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and a master's degree in public health in health service management and policy from the University of Michigan. He completed the American Osteopathic Association Health Policy Fellowship in 1996. Board-certified in emergency medicine, he is also a fellow of the American College of Osteopathic Emergency Medicine.

Beaumont Health is a not-for-profit organization formed in 2014 by Beaumont Health System, Botsford Hospital and Oakwood Healthcare to provide patients and families with compassionate, extraordinary care, no matter where they live in Southeast Michigan. It consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 187 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, more than 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
