Rosanna Morris is president of Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak, part of Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

Morris is responsible for strategy development, daily operations and financial performance of the 1,100-bed Royal Oak hospital, one of the nation's premier academic medical centers. She came to Beaumont in 2016 from Nebraska Medicine, where she held a series of executive positions since 2008, most recently as the system's interim chief executive officer. Prior to taking on the interim CEO role, Morris served as chief operating officer and system chief nursing officer.

Before joining Nebraska Medicine, Morris served as vice president, Patient Care Services and chief nursing officer at Avera McKennan Hospital and University Health Center in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, where she also served as director of Adult Acute Services and manager of Ambulatory Care Services. Earlier in her career, she served as director of Transplant and Acute Care Services at Bert Fish Medical Center in New Smyrna Beach, Florida, and as clinical manager, adult and pediatric multi-organ transplant services at Stanford University Medical Center in California. She began her health care career as a staff nurse in the Multi-Organ Transplant, Trauma and Vascular Services Unit at Stanford.

She has served on the Vizient (UHC) AMC Network Executive Board; as an executive committee board member of the Nebraska Hospital Association; and as a senior clinical associate dean of the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Morris earned her Master of Business Administration from Colorado Technical University and a bachelor's degree in nursing from the University of San Francisco.

Beaumont Health is a not-for-profit organization formed in 2014 by Beaumont Health System, Botsford Hospital and Oakwood Healthcare to provide patients and families with compassionate, extraordinary care, no matter where they live in Southeast Michigan. It consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 174 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
