Lee Ann Odom is president of Beaumont Hospital, Taylor at Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

In this role, Odom is responsible for the financial performance and operations of the 229-bed teaching hospital specializing in orthopedic surgery and rehabilitation medicine. Other services at Beaumont, Taylor include long-term acute care services, general medical surgical services, mental health, pain management, hyperbaric medicine, operative care, emergency medicine, critical care and comprehensive ancillary services. Odom is also executive leader of the Beaumont Health Orthopedic Clinical Care Program.

Odom began her career at Oakwood in 1996 as a physical therapist and has held various leadership positions of progressive scope and responsibility, including administrator of Clinical Services, administrator of Geriatrics and corporate director of Rehabilitation Therapy Services. She is the past president of the Michigan Association of Medical Program Rehabilitation Administrators and has served as a Michigan Quality Council examiner. She is a member of Leadership Detroit XXXV and is a board trustee with Health Emergency Medical Services, Inc.

Odom earned her Master of Science in Administration from Central Michigan University and her Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy from Wayne State University.
