Christine Stesney-Ridenour is president of Beaumont Hospital, Trenton, which is part of Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

In this role, Stesney-Ridenour is responsible for strategy development, daily operations and financial performance of the 193-bed full-service teaching hospital. She came to Beaumont, Trenton in 2016 after serving as vice president and chief operating officer at Beaumont Hospital, Grosse Pointe for eight years. She was part of the inaugural administrative team that transitioned the former Bon Secours hospital to the Beaumont system. Prior to this, she was an administrative director at Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak; an assistant hospital director at Beaumont Hospital, Troy; director of Patient Registration at Beaumont, Troy; and administrative director of the Family Medicine Center and residency program at Troy. She first joined Beaumont in 1985.

Stesney-Ridenour is a fellow of the American College of Health Care Executives. She earned her bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Walsh College and a master's degree in Business Administration from the University of Detroit Mercy.

Beaumont Health is a not-for-profit organization formed in 2014 by Beaumont Health System, Botsford Hospital and Oakwood Healthcare to provide patients and families with compassionate, extraordinary care, no matter where they live in Southeast Michigan. It consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 187 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, more than 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
