Nancy Susick is president of Beaumont Hospital, Troy part of Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue.

In this role, Susick is responsible for the financial performance and operations of the 520-bed hospital and its ambulatory, diagnostic and surgery centers. Before her appointment as president in 2012, she held a dual role as chief operating officer and chief nursing officer at Beaumont, Troy. In these roles, she was responsible for operations and nursing practice, and led Troy to achieving Magnet designation through the American Nursing Credentialing Center.

A registered nurse since 1986, Susick has held various leadership, staff and administrative positions at Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak and Beaumont, Troy. She retired with the rank of Captain from the United States Navy Reserve in 2012 after 24 years of service, and held multiple leadership positions including Commanding Officer, Executive, Administrative and Training Officer. She received numerous military awards, and the Spirit of America award from the city of Troy – the first U.S. Navy Captain and female to receive this recognition.

A fellow of the American College of Health Care Executives and president of its local chapter, Susick serves on the board of the Metropolitan Affairs Coalition and the University of Detroit Mercy. She has earned many significant professional awards and recognitions, including Corp! Most Valuable Professional (overall winner), Becker's 130 Women to Know, the ACHE Regents Award and the Spirit of University of Detroit Mercy Award.

Susick earned her Master of Science degree in nursing from Oakland University and a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from Mercy College of Detroit.
