Nancy Susick, RN, is president of the Royal Oak acute care campus for Beaumont Health, Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue. She is responsible for strategy development, daily operations and financial performance of the 1,100-bed Royal Oak campus, one of the nation's premier academic and community-based medical centers.

Susick was formerly president, Beaumont Hospital, Troy, and previously held a dual role as vice president, chief operating officer and vice president, chief nursing officer at the site. In these roles, she was responsible for operations and nursing practice, leading the way to achieving Magnet designation through the American Nursing Credentialing Center.

A registered nurse since 1986, Susick has held various leadership, staff and administrative positions at Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak and Beaumont Hospital, Troy. She retired with the rank of Captain from the United States Navy Reserve in 2012 after 24 years of service, having held multiple leadership positions including Commanding Officer and Executive and Training Officer. She received numerous military awards.

A Fellow of the American College of Health Care Executives, Susick serves on the board of the Metropolitan Affairs Coalition and the University of Detroit Mercy. Additionally, she has earned significant professional awards and recognition, including Corp! Most Valuable Professional, Becker's 130 Women to Know, the ACHE Regents Award and the University of Detroit Mercy Spirit Award.

Susick earned her Master of Science degree in nursing from Oakland University and a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from Mercy College of Detroit.

The not-for-profit organization was created to provide patients with greater access to compassionate, extraordinary care every day.
