Beaumont, Grosse Pointe is a 280-bed hospital located in the heart of Grosse Pointe. Opened in 1945 by the Sisters of Bon Secours, it was acquired by Beaumont Health System in October 2007. Beaumont, Grosse Pointe offers medical, surgical, emergency, obstetric and critical care services.

Specialty Services

The **John A. and Marlene L. Boll Center for Human Development**, located at the Neighborhood Club, offering diagnostic and therapeutic services for a wide range of learning or developmental concerns; toileting or feeding issues; social skills training; and general behavior management.

The **Beaumont Breast Care Center, Grosse Pointe** providing expedited breast care in a comfortable, home-like setting with specialists in risk assessment and state-of-the-art diagnostic imaging.

The **Janet A. & H. Richard Fruehauf, Jr., Center for Orthopedic Medicine** providing education and pre-and post-surgical care on an inpatient unit dedicated to orthopedics.

Lung Nodule Clinic providing early diagnosis and treatment of abnormal pulmonary nodules.

Beaumont Vein Center specializing in innovative, non-surgical treatments including laser vein ablation, phlebectomy and sclerotherapy for the treatment of spider and varicose veins.

Heart & Vascular services including diagnostic testing, interventional elective and emergency percutaneous cardiac interventions (angioplasty) and cardiac rehab. Also diagnostic and interventional vascular testing and procedures.

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy, wound care, pain management and outpatient cardiovascular, lab, neurophysiology, imaging and pulmonary testing at the Beaumont, Grosse Pointe Medical Building.

Integrative Medicine at the Beaumont Vein Center in Grosse Pointe Farms offering acupuncture, clinical massage, cranial sacral therapy and therapeutic energy touch.

Beaumont Sleep Center at the Beaumont St. Clair Shores Medical Center offering consultation, testing and diagnosis for sleep apnea.
