SPECIALTY SERVICES

Beaumont Heart Center – Featuring the Ernst Cardiovascular Center and Max and Debra Ernst Heart Center with specialty clinics for treating complex heart and vascular conditions; the Ministrelli Women’s Heart Center; and the Tyner Center for Cardiovascular Interventions, a hybrid OR/catheterization suite blending catheter-based procedures with minimally invasive surgery for structural heart disease.

Beaumont Orthopedics – offers a full range of specialized care, including minimally invasive surgery, implants and trauma surgery. One of the nation’s highest-volume joint replacement surgical centers.

Beaumont Cancer Institute – accredited by the Commission on Cancer and designated as a Blue Cross Center of Distinction for the Treatment of Complex and Rare Cancers. One of only 34 community sites in the U.S. Awarded a five-year National Cancer Institute Community Oncology Research Program grant providing access to leading cancer research trials.

Beaumont Surgical Services – offers minimally invasive treatments including advanced endoscopic, laparoscopic and robotic approaches for the treatment of complex surgical conditions. Delivery of chemotherapy or radiation during surgery is also offered.

Beaumont Urology – internationally recognized for endoscopic, robotic, laparoscopic and traditional surgery. Beaumont’s Women’s Urology Center is the first in the Midwest dedicated to women’s urological care and sexual dysfunction.

Beaumont Neuroscience – treating all neurological conditions of the brain and spine for children and adults including stroke, epilepsy, Parkinson’s and Alzheimer’s disease and migraine, among others.

Danielle & Peter Karmanos Jr. Family Birth Center, and the **Karmanos Center for Natural Birth** – offer services to make traditional or natural birth safe and comfortable. Services include maternal-fetal medicine and neonatal intensive care.

Digestive Health – specialized care including bariatric surgery and medically-supervised weight loss programs.

Eye Institute – Comprehensive primary and specialty medical and surgical eye care as well as diagnostic services are provided by board-certified ophthalmologists. Vision exams, low vision evaluations and specialized contact lens services are provided by highly trained, and specialized optometrists. Refractive surgical services including LASIK, and PRK are provided by Beaumont ophthalmologists.

Transplantation – offers innovative and collaborative approaches for the treatment of end-stage renal and liver disease. The transplant team works with organ and tissue recovery programs to provide patients access to donors from across the nation.

Spiritual Care Services and Pastoral Education – Association for Clinical Pastoral Education (ACPE), Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), program-educating Chaplain interns and Chaplain residents, No One Dies Alone Program (NODA), educational partnership providing spiritual health education to OUWB medical students and self-harm spiritual support service.
