Facts and figures



Beaumont Hospital, Taylor (formerly Oakwood Heritage Hospital), is a 189-bed hospital that is a recognized health care leader in the metro Detroit region. It has proudly served Taylor and surrounding communities since 1977 with specialty services that include 24-hour emergency care, hyperbaric and wound care, a surgical pavilion, a pain management clinic, orthopedic surgery, a mental health facility, inpatient physical medicine and rehabilitation and full-service radiology, including advanced CT and MRI.

Specialty Services

Emergency Services – the only emergency room in Taylor for convenient 24/7 care close to home.

Imaging Services – advanced CT and MRI; ultrasound; a variety of diagnostic X-rays, nuclear medicine studies and interventional radiology.

Surgical Services – a wide range of general and specialty procedures; minimally invasive treatments; advanced computer-integrated operating suites for robotic and laparoscopic procedures.

The Richard Kughn Medical Education Headquarters supports the Wayne State University School of Medicine Orthopedic Surgery and Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residency training programs with an advanced medical library, video and web-linked classrooms, on-call rooms, faculty offices and support space.

Orthopedics – A designated orthopedic and joint specialty center offers a full range of specialized care including: orthopedic surgery for total/partial replacement of hip, knee or shoulder; minimally invasive procedures to reduce pain and speed recovery; arthroscopic and reconstructive surgery; complete spinal care; pain management; non-operative orthopedic care; and inpatient and outpatient physical and occupational therapy.

Sports Medicine – athletic training services for schools, athletes and active people for the care of injuries and conditions that can limit activity levels.

Neuroscience – treatment for neurological conditions of

the brain and spine, including stroke, epilepsy, Parkinson's and Alzheimer's disease among others. A full-service rehabilitation unit has space dedicated for specialized stroke and neurotrauma care.

Rehabilitation Services – a 58-bed, comprehensive inpatient rehabilitation facility offering care addressing the medical, physical, emotional and vocational challenges of people with brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, amputation, neurological disorders, orthopedic conditions and multiple trauma. Specialized and intensive programs of care are designed to restore strength, improve physical and cognitive function and promote independence in activities of daily living.

Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy – a medical treatment that enhances the body's natural healing through oxygen therapy in a total body chamber, where atmospheric pressure is increased and controlled. It is used for a wide variety of conditions, including wound care, pain management and diabetic care.

Mental Health – a continuum of behavioral health services to meet the individual needs of patients and their families. Services include inpatient, outpatient and day treatment programs. Coordination among these services allows patients to move from one level of care to another as their needs change. Patients and families are assured of personal, thoughtful care that addresses the physical, psychological and social aspects of well-being.

Community Involvement

Heart Health and Diabetes Screening – consists of blood pressure, cholesterol, glucose screening and risk factor counseling.

Diabetes Prevention Program – a national program in partnership with the CDC to support healthy lifestyle changes for adults with pre-diabetes and those at risk for developing type 2 diabetes. Delivered by trained lifestyle coaches over the course of a year, participants work together to lose body weight and increase their physical activity to reduce their risk for developing type 2 diabetes.

Diabetes Personal Action Toward Health (PATH) – a national six-week program in partnership with the National Kidney Foundation of Michigan providing skills and tools to enhance a participant’s ability to manage type 2 diabetes and work more effectively with health care providers, reducing symptoms and doctor visits.

Healthy Communities – a multi-year initiative that integrates and coordinates primary care, public health and community interventions to improve population health and reduce health care costs.

Cooking Matters – a national program in partnership with Gleaners Community Food Bank of Southeastern Michigan. The six-week program teaches people how to shop for and prepare healthy, affordable meals. A

special version of the program is available for those with diabetes or pre-diabetes.

CATCH Kids Club – CATCH is a national, after-school program that provides a learning and social environment to support physical activity and healthy eating as lifelong habits to maintain a healthy weight.

Child and Adolescent Health Centers – provide expanded access to primary health care, mental health services and health education for children and teens in underserved communities.

About Beaumont Health

Beaumont Health is Michigan’s largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue. A not-for-profit organization, it was formed in 2014 by Beaumont Health System, Botsford Health Care and Oakwood Healthcare to provide patients with the benefit of greater access to extraordinary, compassionate care, no matter where they live in Southeast Michigan. Beaumont Health has total net revenue of \$4.4 billion and consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 174 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, 38,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
