

# Beaumont Hospital, Troy

## Facts and figures



In response to the health care needs of a growing community, in 1977, Beaumont opened a new 200-bed hospital on rural farmland in Troy. Today, Beaumont, Troy has grown to 520 licensed beds and offers a comprehensive array of health care services, continuing to develop to meet the needs of the growing communities it serves.

### Specialty Services

**Oncology/End of Life Care** – this inpatient unit with 44 private rooms is designed to meet the growing need for cancer care. The unit also provides end of life care, including pain and symptom control, for patients of community, state-licensed hospice programs.

**Radiation Oncology** – a leader in diagnosis and accelerated treatment of breast and prostate cancer, the outpatient radiation oncology department, located in Sterling Heights across from the Troy hospital, is equipped with advanced radiation therapy technology and offers the latest treatment options.

**Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit** – offers a complete range of rehabilitation services in a 20,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art setting. Conditions commonly treated include traumatic injuries, stroke, spinal disorders and brain disorders. The unit also provides therapies for patients recovering from surgery or cancer treatment.

**Pediatric Services** – from childhood emergencies to complex medical conditions, Beaumont, Troy offers advanced care for the ones who matter most. Pediatric emergency care features private rooms, special programs and equipment designed for family comfort and safety. For conditions that don't require a trip to the emergency room, the Pediatric After-Hours Clinic is open at night and on weekends, staffed with locally based, board-certified pediatricians. The on-site Pediatric Subspecialty Clinic offers a variety of pediatric specialty services including gastroenterology, cardiology, neurology, pulmonology (lung disease) and elective and emergency surgery.

**Cardiac Progressive Care Center** – designed to care for cardiac patients requiring heart rhythm monitoring and a higher level of nursing care. Patients undergoing percutaneous coronary interventions (angioplasty), heart rhythm studies, pacemaker or ICD implants and open-heart surgery patients are served on this unit.

**Joint and Spine Surgery Unit** – this inpatient unit with 44 private rooms is designed to meet the rapidly growing needs for joint and spine surgery patients. The unit is focused on the care and recovery of joint and spine patients, including post-operative care following knee or hip replacements and spine surgery. A state-of-the-art rehabilitation gym is the core of the unit, focused on physical and occupational therapies and resuming activities of daily living.

**Beaumont Vein Center** – specializes in innovative, non-surgical treatments for spider and varicose veins including laser vein ablation, phlebectomy and sclerotherapy.

**Integrative Medicine** – offers acupuncture, clinical massage, cranial sacral therapy and therapeutic energy touch.

**Obstetrical Services** – Beaumont, Troy offers Neonatal Intensive Care, Maternal Fetal Medicine with imaging, a 28-bed, private room inpatient unit for mothers and their babies and an award-winning Parenting Program. The Family Birth Center is equipped with a natural birthing suite. High-risk antepartum care is also provided in a state of the art, homelike unit.

Specialized care for **Digestive Health**, including a Liver Clinic and a multi-disciplinary Weight Control Center.

**Frances & Dominic Mocerri Learning Center** - the 20,000-square-foot Mocerri Learning Center includes a simulation laboratory with four high-fidelity patient simulators, a clinical skills lab, a computer lab, two Maibach Family classrooms and the 174-seat Farhat N. & Mohammad A. Qazi Family Auditorium.

### Community Involvement

**Project SEARCH Program** – Partnering with the Project SEARCH Program, Beaumont, Troy assists students with special needs on the path to a career after high school. This program combines classroom instruction, career exploration and hands-on training through worksite rotations. Several Project SEARCH students are now employed at Beaumont, Troy.

**Faith Community Nursing** – The Faith Community Nursing program provides health and wellness support in the community with more than 40 nurses and health care professionals in 35 congregations. Services include health fairs and ongoing health information. Beaumont has also placed automated external defibrillators in several churches.

**Silent Witness Event** – Each year, Beaumont, Troy hosts a Silent Witness Ceremony. This service of remembrance, which kicks off National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, includes reading the names and sharing the stories of Michigan women, children and men who lost their lives during the past year due to domestic violence. Life-size silhouettes, known as "silent witnesses," are displayed representing domestic violence victims.

### About Beaumont Health

Beaumont Health is Michigan's largest health care system, based on inpatient admissions and net patient revenue. A not-for-profit organization, it was formed in 2014 by Beaumont Health System, Botsford Health Care and Oakwood Healthcare to provide patients with the benefit of greater access to extraordinary, compassionate care, no matter where they live in Southeast Michigan. Beaumont Health has total net revenue of \$4.4 billion and consists of eight hospitals with 3,429 beds, 174 outpatient sites, nearly 5,000 physicians, 36,000 employees and 3,500 volunteers.
